ELIGIBILITY:

Summer School is open to all students residing within District 96 boundaries.

Non District 96 residents are welcome to attend. Please add a 20% out of district charge to all courses.

Students should be enrolled based on their 2010-2011 grade level.

Example: A child who will finish first grade in June will register as a second grader for all summer classes.

Kindergarten Jump Start is for children who are entering kindergarten in the fall. They must be 5 before September 1, 2010.

REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

1. **Fill** out both sides of the registration form for each child you are registering. The same form can be used for Session 1 and/or Session 2. Copies can be made. Extra registration forms available in all District 96 school offices.
2. **PAYMENT IS DUE AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.** Registrations will not be accepted without full payment and a completed emergency form.
3. **Select** alternate courses in the event courses are cancelled due to lack of enrollment or closed due to meeting maximum enrollment.
4. **Make** a mock schedule using the schedule planner to ensure that course times do not conflict. Save this for the first day of class.
5. **Submit** registration form by April 30. Notification of enrollment will be sent in mid May. A late fee of 20% will be added to all registrations that arrive after April 30.
6. **Refunds** are offered if a class closes due to meeting maximum enrollment or for failing to meet minimum enrollment. (you should include second or third class choices)

No refunds are issued after May 7. Refunds are sent after the August school board meeting.
